Using Revives Civility in Town Government

Start with the Proclamation, then:

1. Place Revive Civility materials into display racks in public places.
2. Work with your town boards to use Revive Civility conversation guides and resources in all public meetings.
3. Encourage all town board members to take a Revive Civility training.
4. Include Revive Civility resources in all comprehensive planning processes.

Third, Where to get Started

Local Units of Government, Nonprofits, Faith Groups, Businesses, and Citizens can connect to many or all of the resources listed. For example, Governing Boards could adopt the Proclamation and then use workshops and exercises to gain a deeper understanding of Civility and Respect.
